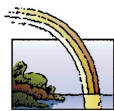
Status quo: 6 travel grants of EUR 1.500 each

Travel grants are assigned to the presenters of the best papers according to the following priority criteria:

Priority 1: PhD students or researchers who completed their PhD in the previous 2 years, who are residents in low income, lower-middle-income or upper-middle income economies.

Priority 2: Researchers who resid in low income, lower-middle-income or upper-middle income economies who have no other source of funding for the conference.

Priority 3: PhD students or researchers who resid in industrialized countries who completed their PhD in the previous 2 years and have no other source of funding for the conference.

Travel grant – new rules from 2019


- 4 travel grants of EUR 1.000 each assigned to residents in low income, lower-middle-income or upper-middle income economies
- 4 travel grants of EUR 500 each will be assigned to residents in Europe.

Travel grants will be assigned to the presenters of the best papers according to the following priority criteria:

Priority 1: PhD students or researchers who completed their PhD in the previous 2 years.

Priority 2: Researchers who have no other source of funding for the conference.


Moreover, a general criteria of gender equilibrium will be applied in the assignment process.

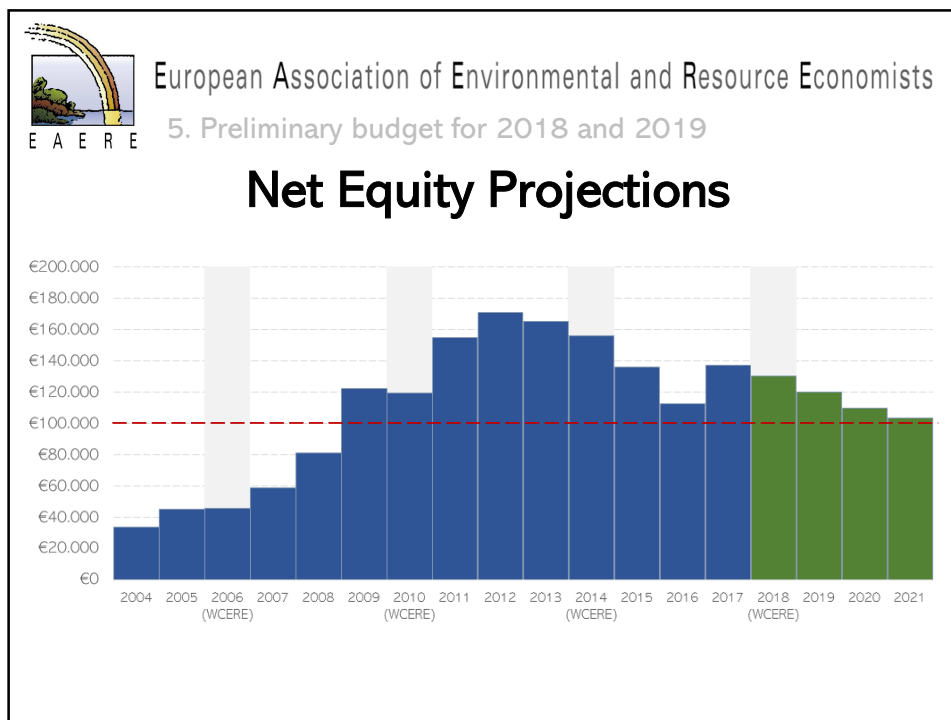

Ratification of members' lists. According to our Statutes (art. 3), the categories individual and institutional members gather individuals and institutions whose application for membership was accepted by the Council of the Association and was subsequently ratified by the General Assembly of Members.

Loss of the status of member. According to our Statutes (art. 4) the status of member ends by resolution of the General Assembly of Members: in the case of individual members, if membership dues are in arrears for one year; in the case of institutional members if the Association has not received further material support for one year.

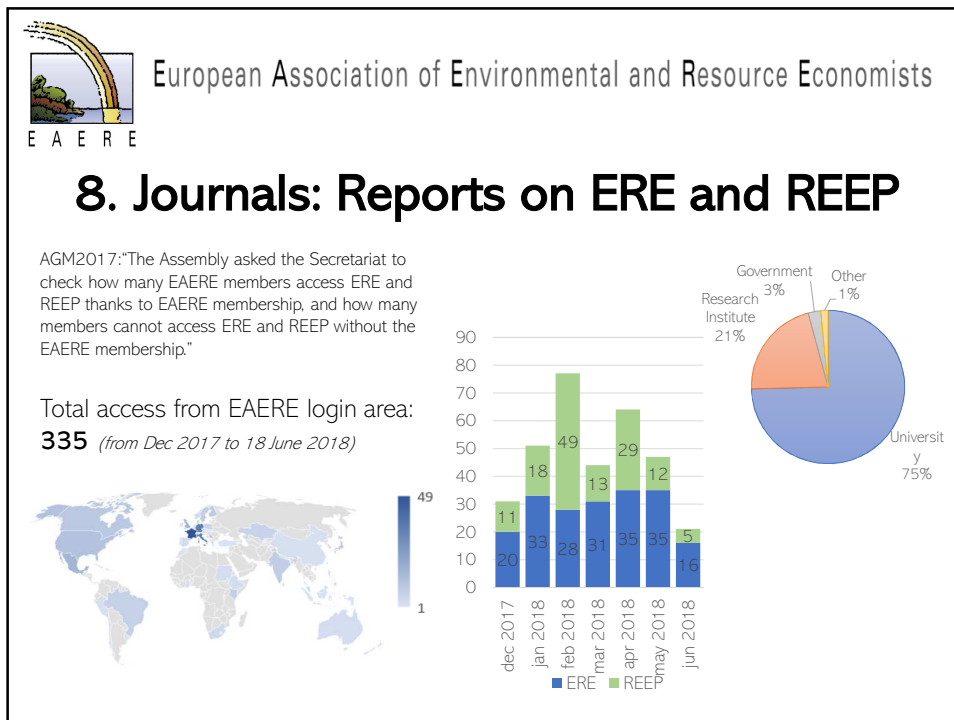



